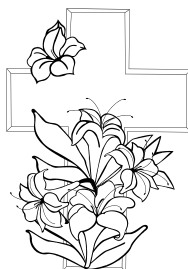
## NOTICES

## MONTHLY SEWING GROUPS

Sewing layettes for needy children is the mainstay of every *Christ Child* chapter in the United States. Cleveland's CC members faithfully carry on this tradition started by Mary Virginia Merrick and her friends in 1887. Each month, volunteers gather at different locations to make blankets and quilts for the Layette project. Four dedicated leaders coordinate the activities of the sewing groups: **Donna Kelly** manages the Chagrin Falls Sewing Group; **Mary McKown** heads the Euclid-Our Lady of the Lake Group; **Connie Kinner** is in charge of the Far West Group; and **Irene Chalko** is responsible for the Heights-St. Dominic Group. Raw materials for the blankets and sewing machines are supplied by our chapter. Volunteers pin, hem, and tape-bind the beautiful blankets and quilts that social workers distribute to children throughout the city.

"Seamstresses" at every skill level are welcome. Women who choose not to sew can assist by trimming and rounding corners on the quilts. **Donna Kelly** assures us "We enjoy having new people sew with us. Many ladies have forgotten what their seventh grade home economics teacher taught them, but they remember after a brief tutoring." But the getting together is about much more than sewing for infants, according to Donna. "Group members form a bond, share experiences, and offer loving support to each other." It's what the *Christ Child* Society is all about – providing a service for the community and, at the same time, nurturing relationships among the members.

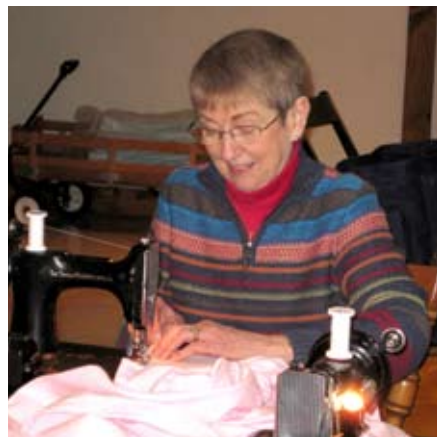
## Donna Kelly

It was 1989 when Tom and **Bea Moore** introduced Peter and **Donna Kelly** to the Cleveland CCS at the Starlight Ball. That evening was memorable. The Kellys were seated with Wilma Smith, a Cleveland celebrity, and Donna won a mink hat that was presented to her by Del Donahue. The following year (1990), Donna became an active member of the Cleveland Chapter with Katie Sennett as her sponsor. She is an enthusiastic cheerleader for all things Christ Child. In 1998, Donna and her husband were *Christ Child* Persons of the Year, and Donna was honored with the Mary Virginia Merrick award in 2007. She has chaired the Immaculate Conception Library program at which she still volunteers, and her lifelong interest in sewing made participating in a sewing group inevitable.

Donna was a medical-surgical nurse until her first child was born. All together, Donna and Peter have six children and fourteen grandchildren. Daughters - Karen, Lynne, Bonnie, and Cheryl – live with their families in the Cleveland area. Son Michael and his family are in San Francisco. Kevin and his family live in Virginia. All of the Kelly children regularly attend the Starlight Balls, and several of them are actively engaged in other ways in the society. In addition to her CCS responsibilities, Donna has many interests, including sewing, knitting and crocheting, working in her garden, and golfing.

For Donna, “The *Christ Child Society* has been all about dear friends and family and what we can do to help others be as blessed as we have been.” Since 1991, Donna has been chairperson of the Chagrin Falls Sewing Group which meets monthly in her home. Her sewing “parties” are so popular that she has scheduled additional sessions each month. Over the years, these sewing women have made several thousand blankets for the children of Cleveland.



## Mary McKown

**Mary McKown** was sponsored by **Goldie Weiss** when she joined the CCS in 1990. During her 20+ years with *Christ Child*, Mary has been co-chairperson for Religious Activities and, since 2004, coordinator of the Euclid-Our Lady of the Lake Sewing Group. She has baked for numerous events, including every Red Wagon Luncheon except one.

Mary attended John Hay High School. After her graduation in 1944, she served as secretary to the Chief Counsel at the Internal Revenue Service. From 1966 to 1986, Mary worked in several divisions of General Electric and was Executive Secretary to a Senior Vice President until her retirement. Retiring did not stop Mary. By all accounts, she is a “ball of fire.” She helps with the Bereavement Groups and works two days a week at DeJohn-Flynn-Mylott Funeral Home, a business owned by her son-in-law. At St. Noel Church in Willoughby Hills, she has worked on PSR, is a Eucharistic Minister, and stays very active with the Social Justice Ministry.

Leland McKown, Mary’s husband, died in 1996. According to **Judy McNulty**, Mary and Lee complimented each other.

“He was very tall; she was very short. He had an Irish sense of humor, and she laughed at all of his jokes.” The McKowns had three daughters: Kathy DeJohn, Patty DeJohn, and Barbara Matoney who died in 2008 from multiple myeloma. Five of Mary’s eight grandchildren are married, and she has seven great-grandchildren. “God is good,” Mary proclaims. For her leisure activities, Mary enjoys reading and golfing. She is a movie buff and loves to bake (no surprise there).

### ***Not a day goes by that I don’t think of the Christ Child Society....***

**Mary Eble** fondly recalls the opportunities that allowed her to “walk into the world of children with special needs.” Way back when – as Mary describes it – she joined a group of women who worked at a religious school founded by Father Goebel of St. Ann Parish. These volunteers included many *Christ Child* members, and they followed a “simple agenda” of reading Bible stories, teaching catechism, and helping the “special” children with art projects and various religious activities. During this period, Dorothy Mylott, a dear friend, sponsored Mary’s membership in the CCS class of 1951.

Soon after joining *Christ Child*, Mary began participating in a new project that involved Sunday visits to Babies and Children’s Hospital then located in South Euclid. Mary used picture books to entertain the children most of whom were confined to their beds and cribs. She remembers the experience as fun, but she had to remind herself constantly that “*Nothing is ever too much to do for a Child.*” This weekend program was so successful that it was replicated at St. Mel’s Parish school on the west side of Cleveland.

Several years later, Mary assisted in the school library at St. Bernadette’s. For 14 years, she conducted reading programs, led book-discussion groups, and encouraged literature appreciation – all done in the name of the *Christ Child* and always remembering Mary Virginia Merrick’s famous words: “...*our charity becomes only the expression of our love, and we are not giving, we are receiving an honor when we help.*”

A final note from Mary: “*Christ Child* does big things with style and grace. We know and applaud that. But, there are many little projects that hold the system together. I am extremely grateful for my 60 years with the *Christ Child* Society. Blessings to all....”
