Merrick House Summer Reading Program – June – August 2011

The Merrick House Reading Enrichment Program will be extended through the summer months this year. **Stephanie West** is recruiting volunteers for the following **Tuesdays 9:30-10:30 a.m.:** **June 7, June 21, July 5, July 19, August 2, and August 16.** If you are able to help or would like more information, please call Stephanie. Students will have a graduation ceremony in August, and CCS members will be special invited guests.

NEW Merrick House Project Expansion

Because of our close connection to Merrick House, we hope to expand our involvement with the children they serve beginning in September, 2011. In order to do this, we must have enough members who are interested in volunteering at the projects. For more information or to volunteer for any of these new projects, please email **Marybeth Bauccho**.

Proposed new volunteer options at Merrick House:

- **Mobile Infant Room.** We would rock and interact with infants and children up to 18 months old. Volunteers would be scheduled twice a month, from 9 a.m. - Noon, at Merrick House.
- **Extension of our current Merrick House Reading Enrichment Program.** Following the one hour spent with the pre-K students, we would add an additional ½ hour and read two stories to the 3 - 4 ½ year olds. Because they are younger, we would simply read to them and discuss the books. There would be no activity or snack with these students.
- **“Life Skills Enrichment”.** This third project would be at Bethany United Church of Christ where Merrick House sponsors an after-school program for 3rd - 8th grade boys and girls from nearby St. Rocco's. The church is located at 41st and Storer, just minutes from I-90. The program, serving 24 children, would be held twice a month, from 3 - 5 pm. This project replaces our former Merrick House Mentoring Program.

The annual bus tour for provisional members was held May 2nd. Nine of the ten new Provisionals visited Layettes, St. Francis Library, Showcase, “My Stuff” Bags, and Merrick House. Sponsored by **Kathy Michael** and a member since 2005, **Liz Niehaus** has been an integral part of the "daily life" of our chapter. She was the editor of *Chapter & Verse* from 2006-2010 and worked at Immaculate Conception Library for four years until the program ended. That experience prepared her for her current role as coordinator of the St. Francis School Library project. Liz also spends time as a "front of the store" worker at Showcase.



Liz, like the CCS members she admires, is active in the community and at St. Raphael's Church where she is a Eucharistic minister. She volunteers at the West Side Catholic Center and the Ohio High School Mock Trial Competition. She is an event volunteer for the Town Hall Lecture Series and just cycled off the Board of Directors of Youth Challenge, an organization that provides social and recreational opportunities for physically disabled children.

A graduate of St. Joseph Academy, Liz received both BS and MS degrees from the University of Notre Dame. She worked as a research lab assistant at the university for three years before becoming a full-time wife and mother. She and her husband Jim, an attorney at Frantz Ward, celebrated their 34th anniversary in April. They have four children, 2 sons-in-law, and one grandson. CCS School Library Program

*St. Francis School**

Founded by German immigrants in 1887, St. Francis School has from its inception been served by the Sisters of Notre Dame. Over the years, as the population of the St. Clair/Superior neighborhood changed, the school evolved from a grade school to a high school back to a grade school – from educating European immigrants' children to educating minority children. Today the 190 St. Francis students are predominantly African-American, with 87% of them living at or below the poverty level. The school's Catholic population is around 10%.

"St. Francis School, in partnership with parents, is committed to providing a safe, caring environment where students can learn gospel living, gain a quality Catholic education and witness to a non-violent way of life." To help achieve the goals of this mission statement, St. Francis is a "PeaceBuilder" school. This proven, national program teaches students to "praise people, give up put-downs, seek wise people, notice hurts, right wrongs, and help others." Every morning, the students recite the PeaceBuilder's Pledge, and each week, the school publically recognizes members of the St. Francis community who have in some way embodied that pledge through their actions.

In an effort to become a more visible presence in the St. Clair/Superior neighborhood and to spread the word about what some school parents say is the area's "best kept secret," St. Francis is getting a facelift. Thanks to a very generous, anonymous donor, there will be a new sign/message board on Superior Avenue, new paint for the school building, new signage over the school door, and hopefully, a real playground for the children.

Our chapter's relationship with St. Francis began in the spring of 2010 when we agreed to take charge of their library. We support the library by purchasing books, supplies, and magazine subscriptions. More importantly, volunteers spend Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the school year reading to kindergarten and primary grade students, helping students find and check out books, re-shelving books when returned, and in general, promoting the love of books and reading! As of May 1, twenty-seven *Christ Child* members generously donated 875.5 hours to the St. Francis Library project. The students, faculty, and staff are extremely grateful for the presence of the *Christ Child* Society in their school. All who have volunteered are grateful for the opportunity to interact with and hopefully, in some small way, make a difference in the lives of the St. Francis school children.
